Keep TETNA Beautiful cleans up community

As winter melted into spring, Tosa East Towne initiated its first "Keep TETNA Beautiful" event. Running during the third week of April in conjunction with Earth Day events around the world, the weeklong event encouraged TETNA members to take action to make our corner of the world a better place.

Social media messages called on neighbors to grab trash bags and rakes and clean up their yards and blocks from the leftovers of winter, and then broaden the action to public spaces around the TETNA neighborhood. Organizers extended the impact with information on how to keep Tosa recycling efforts clean and effective, including links to the new "Waste Wizard" to help neighbors check how to best dispose of common waste items. The week culminated with a food drive for the neighborhood food pantry located outside of Roosevelt School. The pantry is regularly stocked with non-perishables so that local families can take what they need to stretch their groceries, and it has been used regularly over the past year. 

Some ideas include: organizing volunteer groups to clean up specific public spaces or to help neighbors with specific spring projects; weed-outs at the parks and playgrounds in the area; a neighborhood plant exchange; and educational seminars on backyard gardening. Tour of America's Dairyland shifts to Village for 2021

The Tour of America's Dairyland bicycle races will return for the 12th year this month after a COVID-induced hiatus in 2020. But instead of Tosa East Towne, the bikers will race a few blocks away in the Wauwatosa Village for the Day 11 finale.

Day 11 was hosted by the East Town Alliance for several years. Last year, the organization disbanded, so the Village stepped in to help retain Wauwatosa's place in the event. ToAD is the largest competitive multi-day road racing event in the country, attracting about 500 pro and amateur racers per day.

ToAD begins June 16 at the Milwaukee Mile, followed by legs in Janesville, Grafton, Manitowoc, Hartland, the Milwaukee Mile and Shorewood. The tour concludes with a day of races in Washington Highlands on June 26 and then the Wauwatosa Village on June 27.

TETNA residents can walk over and watch the races anytime from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. on most days. National champions and Olympians are among the regular participants. The finale each day, the Men's Pro Race, is the fastest, with speeds topping 35 mph.



Run Tosa Run to return with new race date in September

The pandemic forced TETNA to cancel last year's Run Tosa Run, but enough runners let us keep their registration fee that TETNA still was able to donate \$2,000 to its charity partner, Ronald McDonald House Charities Eastern Wisconsin. Now, after missing the race in 2020 for the first time in seven years, we're looking forward to welcoming runners back to the starting line for Run Tosa Run 2021, scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 18.

BelAir Cantina and GRAEF have signed on again as lead sponsors, and online registration is now open. You can find the link at *runtosarun.org*.

Run Tosa Run is a 5K run/walk and half-mile kids' run through the beautiful tree-lined streets of the

Tosa East Towne neighborhood. The new September date, pending city permit approval, will be a change from our traditional race day on the Saturday in May after Mother's Day. We may return to a May date for 2022, but this year, the delay will help minimize the effects of the pandemic on planning a successful race.

For the 5K, the early-bird price of \$20 is available to anyone who signs up by the end of June. The price will increase to \$25 on July 1, \$30 on Aug. 1 and \$35 on Sept. 1. T-shirts are guaranteed to all who sign up by Sept. 1. Race day entries will be \$40. Men's and women's race winners receive terrific East Tosa prize packages, and all 5K runners will be entered in a drawing for additional prizes.




The kids' run is an untimed loop of one city block and is geared toward runners ages 10 and younger. Parents are invited to run with their children. Cost is \$10.

The block of 69th Street north of North Avenue will be fully closed until about 11 a.m. Other streets on the route will be partially closed during the 5K race, which starts at 9 a.m., for up to an hour.
