Weather for Run Tosa Run on May 20, and turnout at least matched if not exceeded our best year, with 254 people registered for the 5K and 74 in the kids' run. This was the 10th annual Run Tosa Run hosted by Tosa East Towne Neighborhood Association, and we are grateful for all our participants for making this year's event a success.

With net proceeds from the race, the TETNA board at its June meeting approved a donation of \$6,000 to Ronald McDonald House Charities Eastern Wisconsin, matching the event's most successful year.






## Gastropub proposed for former Red Dot building

The Red Dot quickly became a neighborhood meeting place and popular bar when it opened in 2012 on North Ave. Unfortunately a fire that started in the apartment behind the restaurant shut Red Dot down in 2018. Plans to reopen or create a new building on the lot were tossed around but nothing ever materialized.

The building, believed to have been built in 1928, was originally divided into four distinct retail spaces. Since then it has had many lives including several restaurants, a grocery, a sports shop, and a toy store. Many in the neighborhood will remember Shepherd's, a bar that enjoyed a nearly 30 year run in the location.

Now it seems the building may gain another new life. Jason Growel proposed a sports-themed gastropub, named Growlers East Tosa, to the city's government affairs committee on April 25. His proposed plan includes a bar with 25 beers on tap, a main dining area, an outdoor patio, and "a party room for special occasions". The committee postponed approval of Growel's liquor license request, opting to wait until his Conditional Use Permit is also ready to be approved.

So for now, we will have to wait to enjoy a new North Ave spot.




