# Community members discuss the future of the Rosebud

ver 80 people gathered at the Rosebud Cinema on September 9th to have an exploratory conversation about the theater. Spearheaded by TETNA neighbor Dave Celata, the meeting included information from Rosebud owner Lee Barcazk on the state of the theater, small group discussions on possible ways to reopen the theater, and an overwhelming sense of pride in North Ave businesses and in Wauwatosa.

For several years, many of us have closely watched the Rosebud Cinema hoping to see signs of reopening. Though the marquee said it would be reopening soon, the neighborhood theater has remained dark since March 2020. Dave Celata's curiosity

about the beloved movie house led him to contact owner Lee Barcazk a few months ago to inquire about the status of reopening.

The result was an idea to explore the possibility of creating a non-profit that could support operations of the Rosebud modeled after many other community run theaters including the Normal Theater in Normal, Illinois. Dave invited the community to participate in the September 9th and, through word of mouth, received over 400 emails from interested people. The meeting capacity of 100 was met within two days!

Lee, who also owns the Avalon and the Times Theaters, began the meeting by sharing the many challenges to reopening movie theaters after COVID shutdowns. Movie goers didn't immediately return to seeing movies in person. In addition, hiring, training, and retaining staff remains a challenge. Now, over three years since it closed, the Rosebud needs significant upgrades to its technology especially if it is to reopen as a first run theater.

Attendees were then invited into small group discussions to imagine what a non-profit theater group *Continued on page 3...*



might look like at the Rosebud and how it could be realized. Possible uses for the Rosebud included a place for film students to premiere their films, a community meeting space, for live music, for family friendly events, and many others. Most agreed concrete costs to improving the space in order to reopen would need to be identified, and a structure for the non-profit organization would need to be carefully crafted. However the excitement and enthusiasm in the room was palpable.

The meeting ended with a commitment from Lee to provide an estimate of the capital investments required to reopen the theater and the terms he would look for in a lease agreement with a potential non-profit operator should things advance in that direction. Dave promised to send detailed notes of ideas gathered during the meeting and some possible next steps if this idea was to be explored more deeply.

Though there are no guarantees that anything will come of these exploratory discussions, many attendees pledged to commit their time and expertise to the project. Clearly our walkable, neighborhood theater is dearly missed.

# Nighttime Trick or Treat October 28

Join in on the Halloween fun with TETNA's Nighttime Trick or Treat on Saturday, Oct. 28. This annual event will be held from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. and is open to all TETNA members. The whole family is invited to participate, and children ages 14 and younger are welcome to trick-or-treat. Each group of children should be accompanied by at least one adult during the event.

In-person registration will be held at the 69th Street Plaza (69th Street and North Avenue) at the following times and dates:

- Thursday, Oct. 26, 5:30 to 7 p.m.
- · Saturday, Oct. 28, 8:30 to 10:30 a.m.

#### What is Nighttime Trick or Treat?

The City of Wauwatosa typically schedules citywide trick-ortreat hours on the Sunday afternoon before Halloween. Neighborhoods like ours that also want to hold nighttime events must schedule them separately, so TETNA schedules the event for Tosa East Towne residents on the Saturday evening before Halloween.

#### How do I sign up to trick-or-treat?

You can register online or come to the in-person registration hours! Everyone who comes to registration will be given a trick or treat goodie bag courtesy of Waterclock Engineering and The Little Village Play Cafe.

## Have you discontinued the 'candy in, candy out' registration process?

Yes! TETNA has decided to discontinue the 'candy in, candy out' aspect of the registration process. You do not need to contribute a bag of candy to trick-or-treat. Starting this year we ask that all households please hand out their own candy to trick-or-treaters.

While we understand this is a big change compared to the past few years, the event has outgrown the original intentions behind the 'candy in, candy out process'. We ask those with children participating in trick-or-treat to please consider donating a bag to someone on your block if you know they are not trick-or-treating, but are handing out candy.

#### If I can't bring candy, what can I bring?

Food! TETNA will be partnering with the Hunger Task Force to host a food drive in conjunction with our Trick or Treat event. Please stop by our in-person registration hours to drop off your donation. Check out preferred items at www.hungertaskforce.org/what-we-do/myplate/. Donation not required to register.

#### What if I'm not a TETNA member yet?

You can become a member and register for the event at the same time! Our membership year runs from Oct. 1-Sept. 30. To sign up in person, fill out the form included in this newsletter and bring payment with you. Membership is just \$10 per family. We will have extra forms if you forget.

#### Will there be a costume contest and parade?

Yes! We are bringing back the kids costume contest and parade this year. It will be held at Center Street Park sometime before Trick or Treat. Watch for more details on social media and at registration.



#### What are 'spotlight blocks'?

A few "spotlight blocks" will be selected around the neighborhood to enhance their residents' festivities and decorations. All residents then will be encouraged to visit the spotlight blocks and check out the enhancements. One house from each block also will be chosen to win this year's house decorating contest.

### **New Mural Added to North Ave Mural Arts District**

North Avenue became more colorful this summer with the addition of a new mural on the The Real Good Life building located at 7227 W. North Ave.

After issuing a request for proposals earlier this year, the Wauwatosa Tourism Commission chose Cera Street Art (cerastreetart.com) to create the new mural. Jan, of Cera Street Art, has over a decade of experience creating murals for public spaces. His impressive list of past projects includes large-scale murals for Coca-Cola's office buildings and other locations throughout the country.

On his website, Jan states "Murals I am most interested in painting will depict one or two figures/portraits. I'm very excited by the process of storytelling and the idea of the mural featuring a single protagonist. I feel this offers a lot of opportunity for clients to include their vision within

that protagonist, but also helps me to visually celebrate themes like adventure, independence, and wonder."

These themes can be seen in the central figure in his North Ave mural. Holding a lamp to light the way, a bicyclist in motion appears determined and fixed on a goal. The eyecatching colors and shapes surrounding the bicyclist add a vibrancy and add to the story depicted in the mural.

The initial North Ave Mural project started in 2019 with six murals. The Voline Garage Central, a location for one of the original murals, received a refreshed building wrap mural this summer. Funding for these murals, which was approved by the Wauwatosa Tourism Commission, does not come from property tax dollars. Public art projects are funded through hotel/motel tax revenue.


