# 11th annual Run Tosa Run 5K and kids' run set for May 18

Run Tosa Run rebounded from pandemic disruptions in a big way during TETNA's 2023 race, with more than 250 people entering the 5K and nearly 75 in the kids' run. Those participants and our generous sponsors helped us raise enough money to donate \$6,000 to our longtime charity partner, Ronald McDonald House Charities Eastern Wisconsin.

TETNA is looking to build on that recent success with Run Tosa Run 2024, which is scheduled for Saturday, May 18. Registration for our 11th annual run is now open, and you can lock in the early-bird \$25 rate for the 5K by signing up by March 1. The kids' run, about a half-mile loop

of one block, is just \$10. Both events come with a race T-shirt for all those who sign up by May 1.

A big thanks to lead sponsors BelAir Cantina and GRAEF, longtime neighborhood supporter Lutheran Home and new sponsor Kuchler & Cotton, S.C. Whether you come out to run, walk, cheer or volunteer, we hope to see you on May 18. 





# TETNA Trick-or-Treat reigns supreme



# TETNA offers scholarship to neighborhood high school senior

Each year TETNA offers a scholarship to a high school senior from our neighborhood who is a TETNA member and who will be graduating from a local high school and plans to continue their education at a college, trade or technical school. Thanks to generous neighborhood donors, the amount of the scholarship has increased to \$1,000 this year.

The scholarship is intended to recognize neighborhood high school seniors whose activities demonstrate support for TETNA's philosophy: to provide a welcoming and nurturing environment and to maintain the quality of life and sense of community through shared interests and neighborly interaction.






# Annual Neighborhood Rummage Sale



The 2024 Tosa All-City Read book is *We Were the Lucky Ones* by Georgia Hunter. Inspired by the incredible true story of one Jewish family separated at the start of World War II, determined to survive—and to reunite—*We Were the Lucky Ones* is a tribute to the triumph of hope and love against all odds. 
